1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Davis called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

2. ROLL CALL OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Chair Davis reported that all members were present.

3. REPORT REGARDING POSTING OF AGENDA

Imelda Martin, Executive Assistant to the Board and General Manager, reported that on Friday, April 3, 2009, the agenda for the meeting was posted at MTD's Administrative headquarters, on MTD's website, mailed to all who have requested the agenda and sent to the media of general circulation.

CONSENT CALENDAR

4. APPROVAL OF PRIOR MINUTES (ATTACHMENT- ACTION MAY BE TAKEN)

The minutes of the prior meeting were discussed at length; Chair Davis asked that the position of the Board needed more detail regarding the UCSB Long Range Development Plan EIR.

Director Weinberg moved to approve the draft minutes for the meeting of March 10, 2009. Director Britton seconded the motion. Upon a request from Chair Davis of amendments on the minutes, the motion passed unanimously.

5. CASH REPORT (ATTACHMENT- ACTION MAY BE TAKEN)

Director Britton moved to approve agenda item # 5, Cash Report for March 3, 2009 through March 16, 2009. Director Aceves seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

THIS CONCLUDED THE CONSENT CALENDAR

6. PUBLIC COMMENT

Grecia Lima from PUEBLO Education Fund urged the Board to consider making changes to the Line 8 in a timely manner. Ms. Lima requested that the Service Plan meeting be held in the evening to accommodate working bus riders. Ms. Lima thanked the Board for the evening Transit Talk Meeting held on March 13th.

Nancy Rowan from CLUE and STUC thanked the Board for the evening Transit Talk Meeting of March 13th. Additionally, Ms. Rowan requested that the hybrid buses remain in the budget.

7. FISCAL YEAR 09-10 DRAFT BUDGET (ATTACHMENT–ACTION MAY BE TAKEN)

Assistant General Manager/Controller, Jerry Estrada provided the Board with an overview of the proposed FY 2009/10 budget and requested the Board's guidance regarding the draft budget.

During the review, Mr. Estrada reported that there have been a number of changes in the past twelve months with Measure A passing, fare increase, diesel fuel costs, the State impact and the economy.

Mr. Estrada reported that Sales Tax revenue (TDA-LTF) reflects a decrease of approximately \$1 million dollars from previous estimates.

Mr. Estrada also stated that the passenger fares reflect an estimated increase of \$1.2 million dollars based on the fare increase.

An additional revenue impact is the expiration of contracts with the cities as MTD becomes a direct recipient of Measure A funds as Measure D expires in March of 2010.

The capital budget also included the acquisition of seven 40' hybrid buses, nine 40' diesel buses and eight 22' shuttles. Security related projects associated with the Olive operating facility, new ticket vending machines and services vehicles are also included. Director Weinberg raised a question of hybrid vs. diesel buses, Mr. Estrada stated that MTD is currently seeking additional funding for the purchase of the hybrid buses. Director McQuary commented that he supported the hybrids purchase.

Mr. Estrada also stated that MTD's collective bargaining agreement with the Teamsters expires at the end of FY 2010. Upcoming negotiations are expected.

Nancy Rowan with CLUE and STUC, had questions regarding the Line 8, commented on her support on the hybrid purchase and the ticket vending machines.

David Pritchett, SBCAN and STUC, Mr. Pritchett presented a question in regards to the reserve fund in the budget. He also commented on his support for hybrid purchases and suggested a co-operative with other agencies to negotiate purchase

prices with hybrid bus manufactures.

Mr. Pritchett requested that the upcoming meetings be held in the evening and that they be televised. He also requested to have informal discussions with Staff and Board members.

Director Weinberg suggested when forecasting passenger fares revenue value to note the extent of layoffs in the community.

Director Aceves asked if we had a system to test the demographics of our passengers such as surveys to tell us what our ridership is. Mr. Estrada stated that data is collected at the farebox. Mr. Damiano added that monthly ridership reports are used in-house and offered to provide them to the Board.

Director McQuary raised questions regarding the Mobile On Time Performance System (MOPS) Mr. Estrada stated that the MOPS program is the program our planning departments uses to identify on time performances.

Director McQuary asked a question regarding an increase in security service; General Manager Fisher stated that it was due to the addition of having someone man the upcoming vending machines.

Following a question from Director McQuary in regard to the Overpass Site, Mr. Estrada stated that the figure would be adjusted in the final budget given that the property has been leased.

Director Aceves further suggested a discussion of considering a two year budget. Chair Davis requested a future meeting with the Finance Committee to discuss this recommendation.

Following an in depth discussion the Board agreed upon scheduling an evening televised meeting on May 6, 2009 at 5:30 p.m. followed with "Open House" days to provide the public with an opportunity to come to MTD's Administration Office and meet with our staff with any questions regarding MTD's proposed route and schedule changes. The Board will then meet with public interest groups within the community and returning to a Board meeting with the results of the input sessions, submitting the information to Mr. Estrada for preparation on the draft budget and returning to the Board.

General Manager Fisher stated that the UCSB Economic Forecast Summit is scheduled for Thursday, April 23rd.

The General Manager reported that she and Steve Maas, Manager of Strategic Planning and Compliance, updated the status of the Valley Express to the Solvang and Buellton City Councils.

Mr. Estrada updated the Board on the current Stimulus status.

General Manager Fisher reported that the Safety and Security CEO Certification for calendar year 2008 has been submitted to the National Transit Database as required by the Federal Transit Administration.

General Manager Fisher also reported that Tiara Lakey had resigned as Executive Assistant to the Board and General Manager to join her husband's business in Ventura. Ms. Lakey will be missed by all.

General Manager Fisher also announced the promotion of Imelda Martin, Office Manager to the position of Executive Assistant to the Board and General Manager. Subsequently, recruitment efforts have begun for the front desk position.

SUBJECT: Recommended August 24, 2009 Service Changes

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive presentation regarding service reallocation.

DISCUSSION:

The Santa Barbara Metropolitan Transit District Staff received input from the community at five open house information sessions which were held during the week of April 20th. A dedicated e-mail address and voicemail box were also established. Meetings were held with Supervisors Carbajal & Wolf, and with IVPAC. Additional meetings are scheduled with Supervisor Farr, Associated Students at UCSB, Goleta City Council, and County Staff.

Staff continues to gather input from the community and has been making adjustments accordingly. Staff will present a final recommendation to the MTD Board of Directors on May 19th.

The Transit Development Staff reviewed each and every trip by day type and hour to determine the level of productivity. The result of this analysis is reflected in the recommended service reallocation which you will see in attachment A. Detailed route and schedule recommendations have been distributed to the community and can be found in attachment B.

Detailed analysis and data will be presented at the May 6, 2009 meeting of the Board of Directors.

Line 8 & 9 (the Calle Real-Old Town Shuttle) routes and schedules have long been interrelated. The currently proposed reconfiguration provides better service to passengers, while at the same time creating more efficiency in our system, resulting in an average overall savings of 26 minutes per day.

Occasional extended trips on Line 8 will connect the Fairview Area with County Health and La Cumbre. To accommodate requests for bus service on Patterson Avenue as well as on Fairview, the Calle Real-Old Town Shuttle will operate as a one-way counter-clockwise loop every 30 minutes.

Occasional extended trips on Line 8 will connect the Fairview area with County Health and La Cumbre.

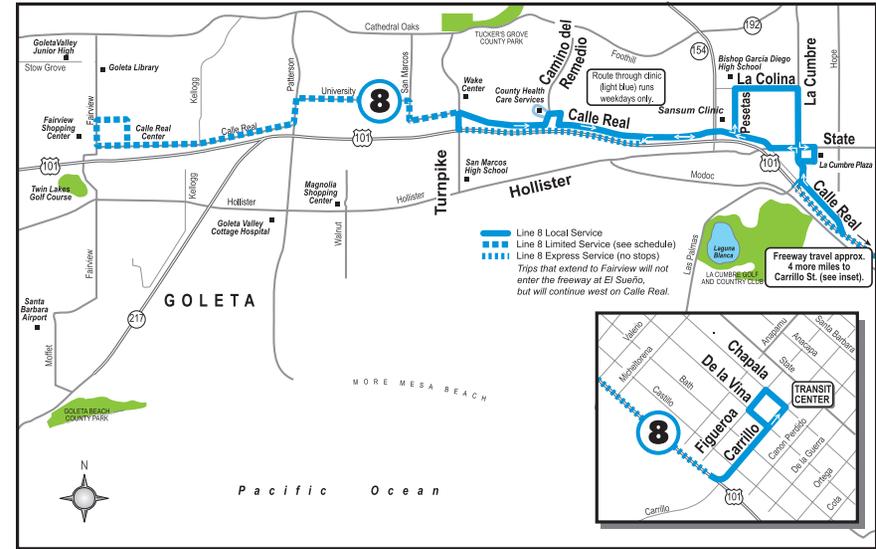
Advantages:

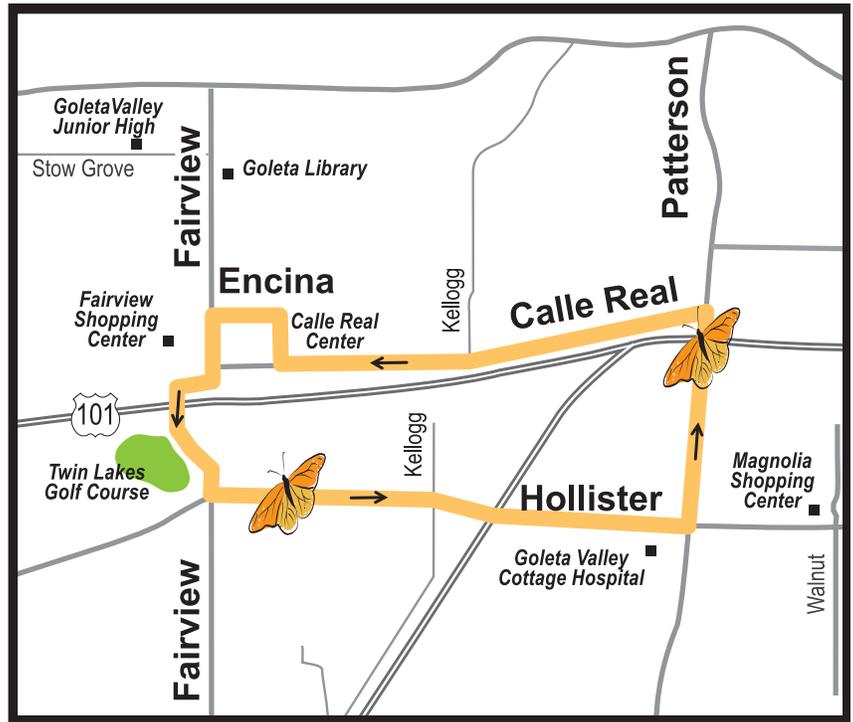

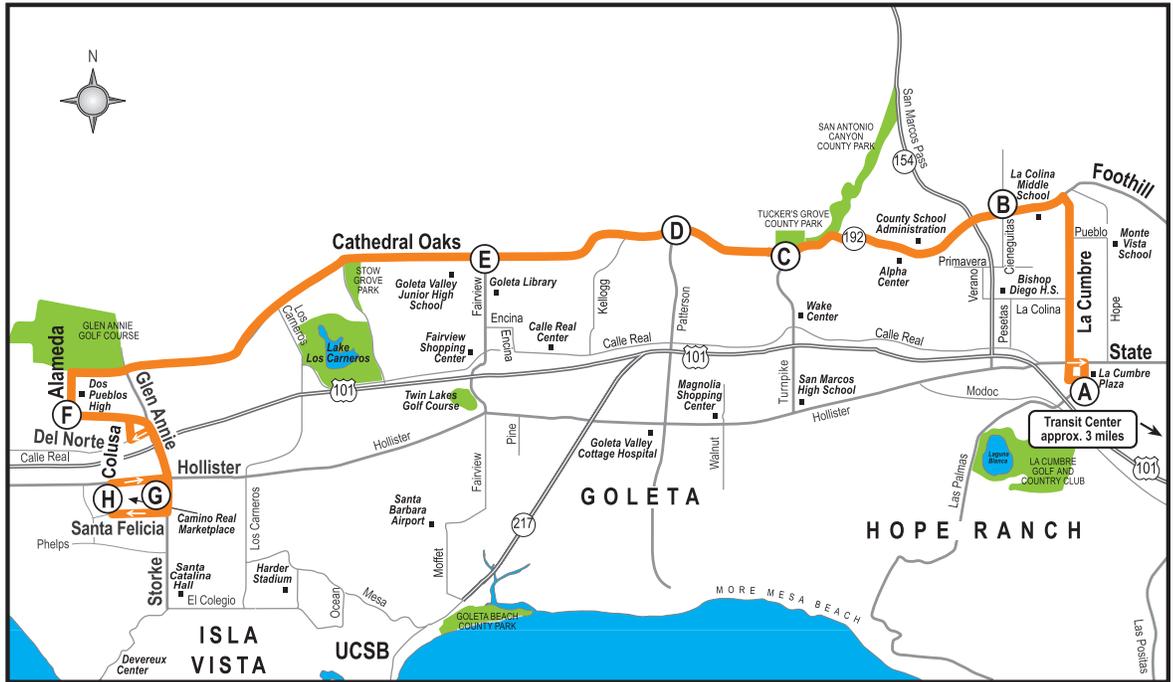

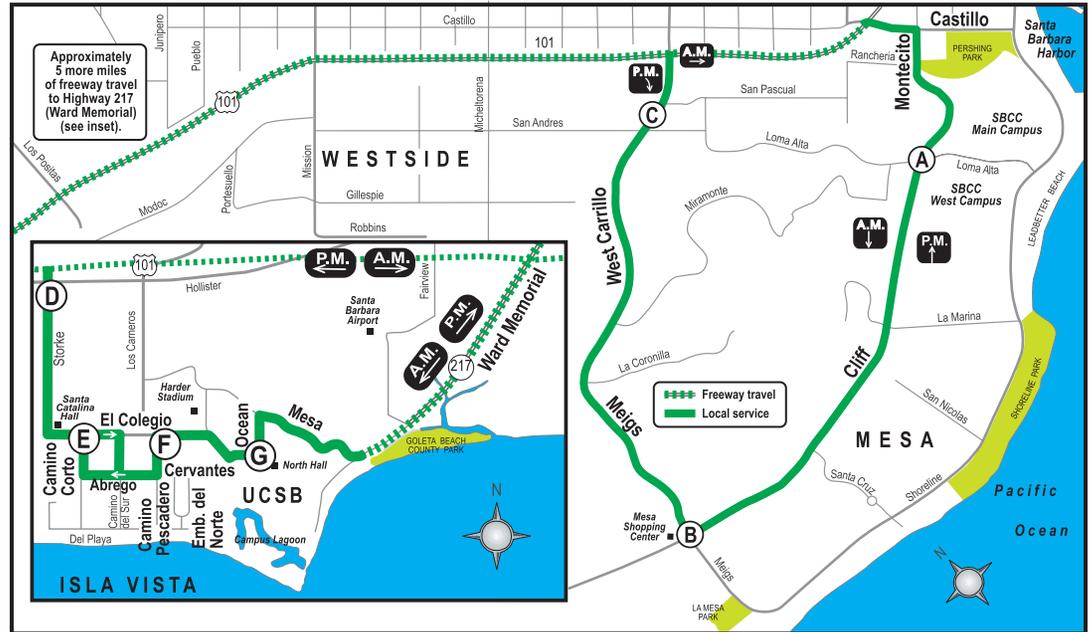

Proposed Reduction in Mid-Day Service

Ridership on Line 22 is very low, but we consider it 'lifeline' service and therefore have no plans to eliminate the route entirely.

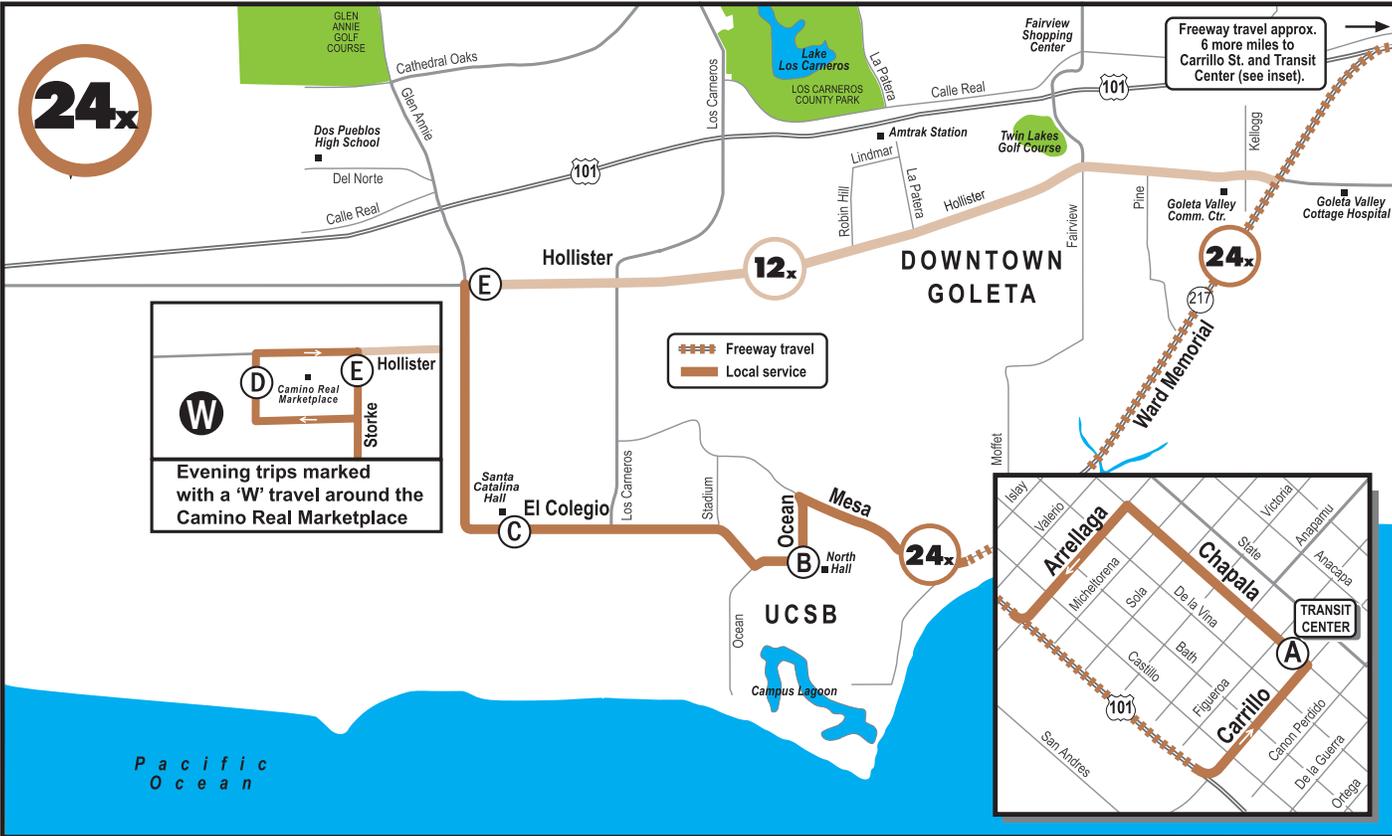
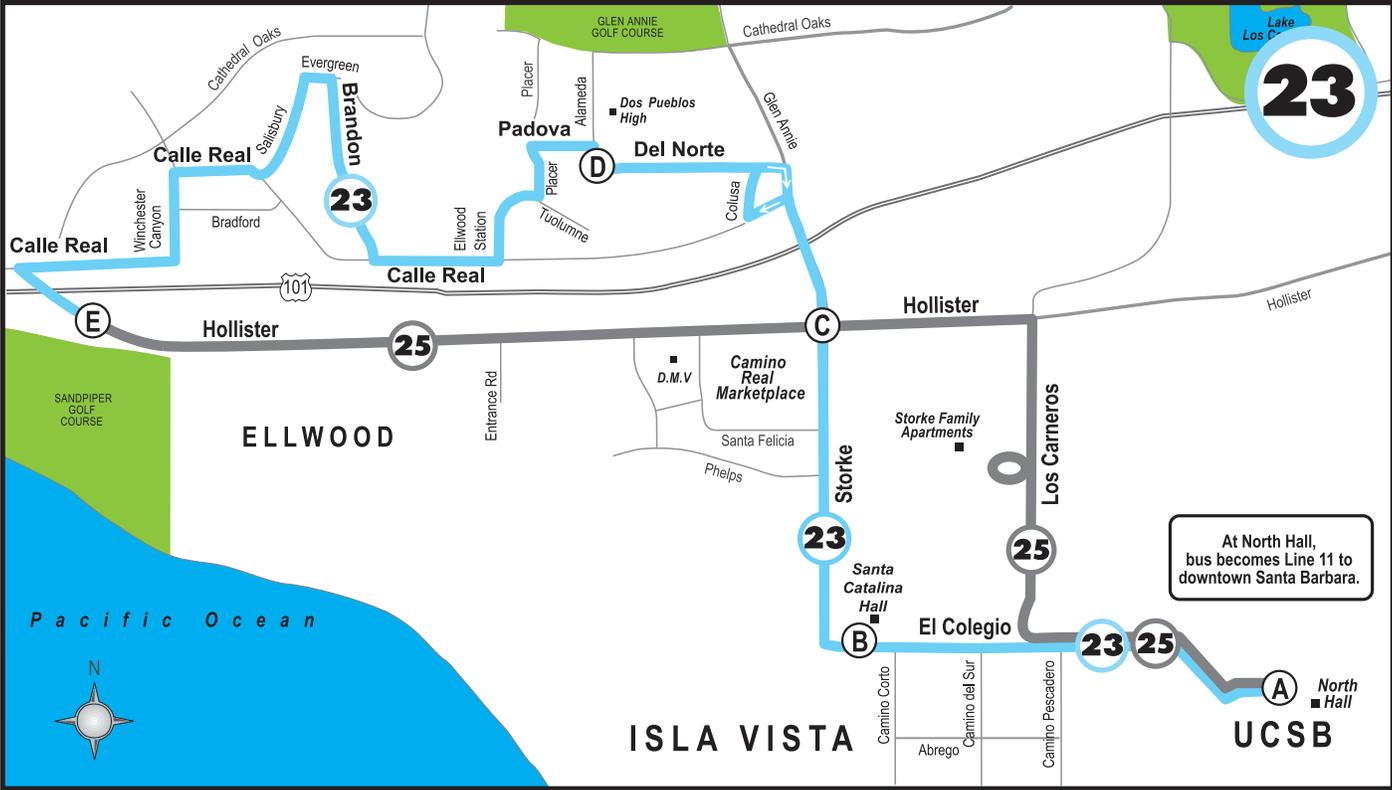

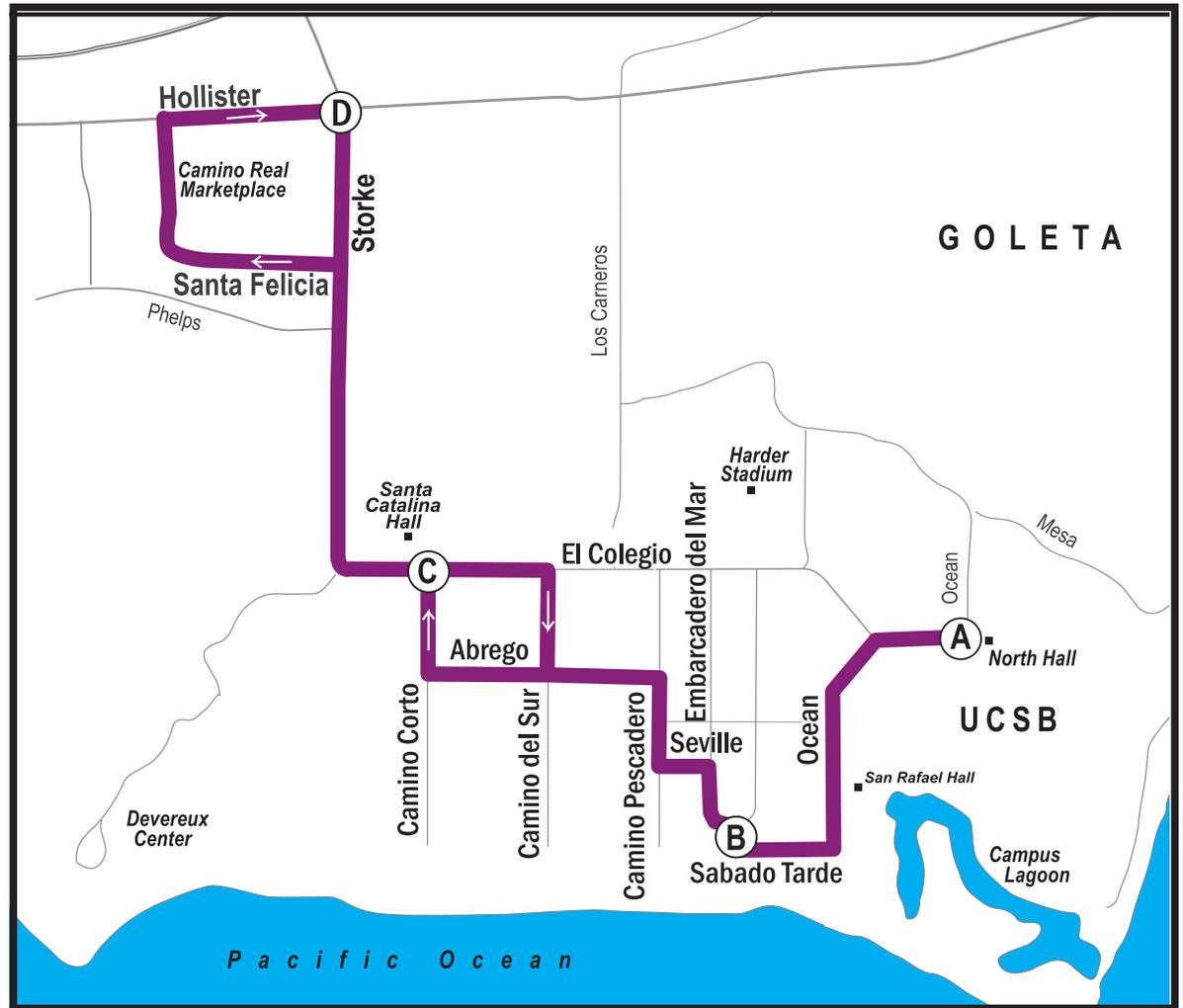

MTD has been awarded a Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ) Grant to replace the existing Line 27 with a new Isla Vista Shuttle. 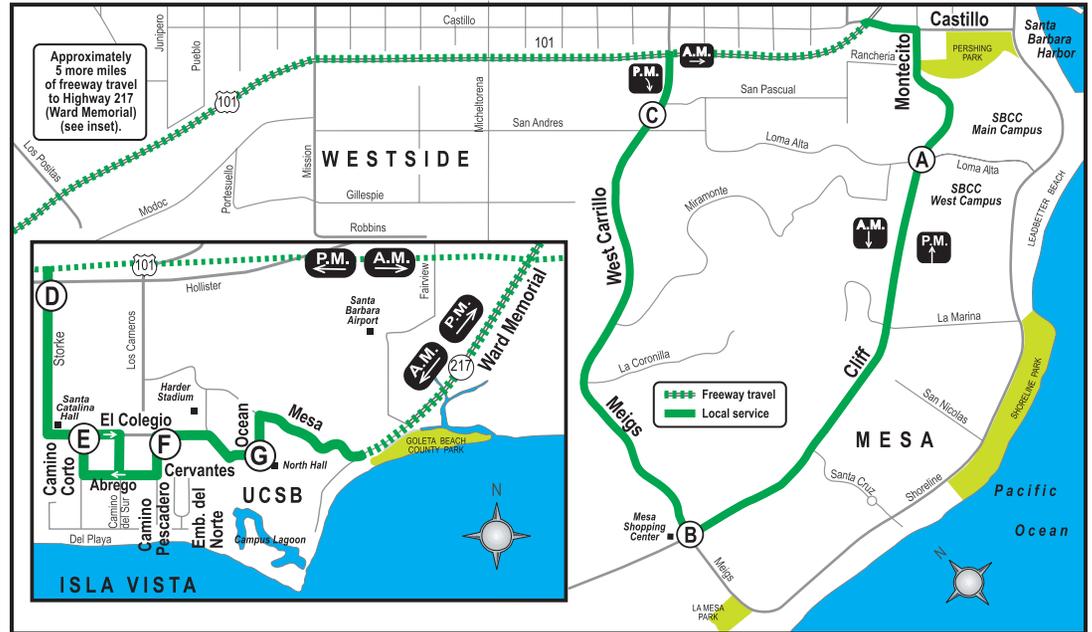

Subject: Administrative Update

Development staff has been listening to the public, working out the details of proposed route & schedule changes, and preparing recommendations for August service reallocations. Staff organized a series of five 'Open House' meetings to get input on the proposals. These meetings were publicized via interior ads and flyers on the buses, an announcement on the website, loudspeaker announcements at the Transit Center many times per hour, and information was sent to Line 8 passengers, PUEBLO, STUC, and CLUE. Additional meetings have been held with stakeholders including the Isla Vista community, UCSB, and Supervisors Janet Wolf and Salud Carbajal, as well as a pending meeting with Supervisor Doreen Farr.

Mayor Aceves presented preliminary information regarding routing for the Old-Town Calle Real shuttle to Goleta City Council at their last meeting. The council will hear the complete proposal Tuesday afternoon prior to the MTD Wednesday board meeting.

The Community Environmental Council, the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District, the Santa Barbara Car Free Project, and the City of Santa Barbara all worked with MTD to provide free bus rides on Earth Day, Sunday April 19th. Although ridership data isn't finalized yet, MTD carried approximately 14,000 passengers on Earth Day – 39% more than recent average Sunday ridership (approximately 10,000)!

An MTD electric shuttle was included in the Green Car Show at Earth Day, staffed by Steve Hahn (ably assisted by his son William) and Cynthia Boche. Members of the public were impressed with our electric fleet statistics: 13,000,000 passengers and 3,000,000 miles on the 20-year-old fleet so far. David Damiano worked at the Santa Barbara Car Free booth, where attendees who rode the bus to Earth Day received stickers and anyone who got to the event without a car was entered in a drawing.

Cruise ships will visit Santa Barbara on Saturday, May 2nd, Sunday, May 3rd, and Sunday, May 10th. Each visit could bring as many as 3,000 passengers and crew members to visit our fair city. The Waterfront District has requested that we begin running the Downtown-Waterfront Shuttles an hour early on those days to accommodate the expected crowds. The Waterfront District will reimburse MTD for the extra revenue time.

Staff submitted a grant application to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for MTD's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) stimulus funding. The \$4.3 million grant application includes ticket vending machines, replacement service vehicles, and replacement buses. FTA is in the process of approving the application.

Staff also submitted monthly MTD, Easy Lift, and Clean Air Express Ridership reports and Safety & Security reports to the National Transit Database for March. The FTA requires these monthly reports.

Staff executed a grant amendment with FTA to increase the funds in MTD's "Intermodal Transit Center Expansion" grant by adding \$125,400 in additional Federal earmark funds to the project, along with the required local matching funds. Following the amendment, the grant includes a total of approximately \$228,000. The project is for a preliminary study to identify the resources needed for the expansion.

Staff participated in a conference call hosted by Federal Transit Administration (FTA) staff regarding Civil Rights compliance requirements for the stimulus capital funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The requirements are similar to those that MTD already complies with for the annual FTA Operating Assistance funds.

Steve Maas and I attended a meeting of the Isla Vista Project Area Committee (IV-PAC) & General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC) on April 29th to update the committees on the planned implementation of the Isla Vista/UCSB Shuttle in late August. The PAC and the GPAC are committees of the County's Redevelopment Agency.

I was guest speaker on the Chamber's Commerce radio spot with hosts Steve Cushman and Rob Egenoff. Yesterday I attended a roundtable hosted by the Santa Barbara Chamber seeking solutions for our community related to the problems created by the current economy.

Jerry Estrada, Dick Weinberg and I attended Carpinteria's State of the City address on Thursday morning.

The rebuild of charger #17 is complete. The plan now is to set up one of the two spare chargers for use in charging battery packs undergoing testing. This will improve the pack turn-around time, because the 30-hour charging profile impacts the overall testing time required.

The EV parts storage racks and wire mesh bins have been delivered.

Twenty replacement Nova bus windshields have been received. Two have been used and eighteen are in inventory.

A tractor and mower are being reserved for the first week of May for mowing the ground cover on the Calle Real property.

The five-year recertification of the Administration building fire sprinkler system has been successfully completed.

Repair of problematic Ni-Cd battery packs is ongoing.

Congratulations to mechanic Juan Martinez, who successfully passed the testing for a Class A CDL to qualify for towing buses.

Salvage Ni-Cd modules (five crates of 46 each) have been packaged for shipment to Saft in Valdosta, GA. Additionally, a battery pack that was damaged from a sudden gas release will be sent to Saft for evaluation.

Preliminary prices have been obtained for a 2009 one-ton cab & chassis (the utility bed will be transferred from the present truck), a 2009 one-ton stake bed truck with lift gate and crane, a 2009 half-ton pickup truck, and a 2009 ten-ton tilt-bed trailer capable of transporting MTD shuttles. Total pricing falls within the guidelines for available economic stimulus monies.

All Operations supervisors as well as staff of Operations and Risk have completed renewal classes in CPR.

Doug Wixson will be the 2009 Summer Shuttle Supervisor. Congratulations Doug! The increased shuttle service will begin on the Memorial Day weekend, following a meeting to prepare for the increase.

All drivers are bidding for summer service that will be effective in June. The Memorial Day bid is complete. MTD will run Sunday service on Monday, May 25th, Memorial Day.

Finance staff is working on finalizing the budget for next fiscal year. Once the service plan for next year is approved, the draft budget will be updated and brought before the board in June.

MTD has awarded a contract for the removal of lifts and backfill at the Overpass site. Work is scheduled to begin within the next week. Also, staff is working with Santa Barbara County to adjust the property tax for the Overpass site now that the property has been leased.

Staff has begun work on a federal grant application to cover the cost of seven replacement buses. If received, this grant would cover the cost of purchasing hybrid buses rather than diesel.

We are pleased to announce that the vacancy in customer service has been filled by long-time bus driver Jack Graham. He retired from driving as of Monday, April 27th, and began his first day as a Customer Service Representative at the Transit Center the following day. Although Jack chose to retire from his driving career, he wanted to stay in the MTD fold in this new position. We are honored to have Jack's continued assistance.

HR held a driver orientation and video exam on Friday April 24th. Candidates who successfully passed the video exam are being interviewed for the four vacant driver positions.

We are pleased to welcome Kate Schwab to MTD, beginning April 29th in the position of Communication Specialist. Kate moved to Santa Barbara nearly 14 years ago to run Borders on State Street, with her most recent position there as District Marketing Manager. She is active in the Downtown Organization, the CALM organization, the Santa Barbara Book & Author Festival, and has served eight years on the Downtown Parking Committee.

We would like to congratulate Carlos Moreno on his retirement from MTD. Mr. Moreno has worked as a bus driver for more than 10 years. We wish Carlos a happy and healthy retirement!
