#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Staff recommends that the Committee receive a report on selected California Transit Association (CTA) legislative priorities and provide direction to staff.

## **DISCUSSION:**

Staff studied CTA's list of "priority legislation" and selected those that appear to be of potential interest to MTD. Each of those bills is briefly discussed on the attachment, which also provides a table of the selected bills.

Staff has also included Proposition 69 in the attachment. Proposition 69 will appear on the June ballot. If approved, it will protect Senate Bill (SB) 1 funds from diversion to purposes other than transportation.

# ATTACHMENT California Transit Association: Selected Priority Legislation

Several bills that are included in the "Priority Legislation" of the California Transit Association (CTA) may be of interest to MTD as well. Links to each of the bills are provided in the table below. Proposition 69, which is not included in the table below, may also be of interest.

- <u>Proposition 69</u>: Would require that revenue from the diesel sales tax and Transportation Improvement Fee (SB 1) be used for transportation-related purposes, and would exempt revenue generated by SB 1 from the state appropriations limit.
- AB 1905: This bill would make it more difficult for opponents of a project that reduces vehicle miles traveled (VMT) to halt the project.
- AB 2650: This bill would allow transit agencies to sell advertising on illuminated headsigns.
- <u>AB 3201</u>: Funds from the referenced program are currently available only for pilot-type projects. This bill would add "large scale deployments" to the list of eligible projects for the program.
- ACA 4: This bill would lower the required vote from 2/3rds to 55% for taxes for the purposes stated.
- SB 1119: This bill would allow for exceptions to the requirement to use 50% of LCTOP funds for
  projects that benefit a "disadvantaged community." This would not currently affect MTD but may in
  the future.
- <u>SB 1434</u>: This bill would require electric utilities to design rate plans that would encourage the use of zero-emission vehicles.
- SCA 6: This bill would lower the required vote from 2/3rds to 55% for taxes for the purposes stated.
